She encouraged others to do the same. Throughout her life, Barb competed in cross-country bike trips, marathons, and triathlons, and inspired many to follow her example.

Her attitude and sense of humor were an inspiration to all who knew her. Even when she was fighting cancer for the second time, she was always thinking of others. Brittany worked for the YMCA in the SACC program starting in her junior year until she was called to work at Fort Drum's Child Development Center in 2006. Brittany was a positive role model and spoke of helping children with learning disabilities, like herself. Through Brittany's education, supportive services were essential to allowing her to reach her to reach her academic potential. Therefore, we know she would be honored for this scholarship to be given in memory of her. We would like to encourage an energetic individual who cares to follow their dreams.

DICK P. CASE MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP

Dick P. Case was born March 19, 1919. He graduated from Dexter High School in 1936. After school Dick entered Ithaca College and graduated in 1941 with a Bachelor in Science with a major in music education.

In November 1945 Dick began his teacher career in Dexter when he became supervisor of instrumental and vocal music at Dexter High School. When the merger of the Dexter and Brownville schools took place, Dick held the same position in the new General Brown Central School District.

During his teaching career, Dick continued his education, receiving his master's degree from Ithaca in 1950 and another masters from St. Lawrence University in 1953. Dick not only held a teaching license, but also was certified in guidance and administration.

Over the years the General Brown music program became one of the strong points in the school's program. Mr. Case taught his students discipline and responsibility. Many of his pupils became accomplished musicians in their own right. He was highly esteemed by his fellow workers and the citizens of the General Brown community.

In the spring of 1978 Dick Case announced his retirement from teaching. This news saddened all who knew Dick and was accepted with regret by the General Brown Board of Education. We were all happy to see Dick able to enjoy a well-deserved retirement, but it was all too short. On Saturday, February 3, 1979, Dick died. As a tribute to Dick, the General Brown High School suspended operations on Monday morning, February 5th, as all staff attended his funeral and said a last goodbye.

- 2. The Merrill F. Hurd/Donald J. Grant Memorial Scholarship and the Town of Brownville Lions Club shall be in the amount of \$400.00, paid \$200.00 per school year, for two consecutive years.
- 3. The Mark Andrew Dean Memorial Scholarship shall be in the amount of \$200.00, paid one time only.
- 4. Each scholarship will be used at a school in **NEW YORK STATE ONLY**.
- 5. Will be paid directly to this school as part or complete payment of tuition or bona fide school charges.
- 6. Will be awarded before July 1st
- 7. Will be awarded annually, effective with the fall semester of school
- 8. May be canceled if deemed advisable by majority of members voting at an official meeting. The Town of Brownville Lions Club reserves the right to cancel the program without prior notification.

SECTION II - CANDIDATES FOR SCHOLARSHIPS

- 1. Must be a resident of the Town of Brownville, and/or attending General Brown School system
- 2. May be either Male or Female
- 3. Must be a high school senior or high school graduate
- 4. Can be a veteran, under 22 years of age
- 5. Must submit application for scholarship to the Town of Brownville Lions Club no later than March 1st of the year in which they wish to apply
- 6. Must present a letter of recommendation from their High School Principal or Unit Commander at the time they make their scholarship application
- 7. Must adhere to all rules and regulations set for the herewith

SECTION III – RECIPIENT OF SCHOLARSHIP

- 1. Shall meet all requirements of Section II
- 2. Will be selected by a panel of three members, as defined in Section IV
- 3. Shall be selected from the ranks of the applicants with the most suitable educational record as determined by the panel, as defined in Section IV
- 4. Shall be eligible and accepted by the school he plans to attend. Proof of eligibility and proof of acceptance must be shown by April 15th, if possible. Tentative awards may be made pending receipt of these proofs.
- 5. Will be informed of their selection before the Annual Installation of Officers Meeting in June
- 6. May use the scholarship at the school of his choice in New York State
- 7. Must be candidate for the freshman class of their school at the time of their scholarship award for the first year

- 8. Must successfully complete their first year of schooling to be eligible for the second year scholarship. This second year award shall be automatically received upon presentation of proof of successful completion of the freshman year, and must be used for the next school year.
- 9. In the event that there are no eligible candidates for the freshman award, a one-year scholarship may be offered to one of the two runners-up of the previous year, in order chosen, who has successfully completed his freshman year at the school of higher learning.
- 10. In the event that there is no eligible candidate for the sophomore award, a one-year scholarship may be awarded to one of the two runner-up of the previous year, in the order chosen, who has successfully completed his freshman year at the school of higher learning.

SECTION IV - PANEL MEMBERS

- 1. Shall be three in number
- 2. Shall not be residents of the Town of Brownville, a member of the Town of Brownville Lions Club, an employee or faculty member of the school systems attended by eligible candidates for this scholarship
- 3. May be either Male or Female
- 4. Shall be a citizen of Jefferson County
- 5. Shall be selected by members of the Education Committee
- 6. Shall be prominent leaders in their fields
- 7. Shall select the recipient of the scholarship(s) each year by either unanimous or majority vote
- 8. Shall, as a panel, hold a preliminary meeting to determine which applicants will be selected for interview
- 9. Shall then personally interview the selected applicants by May 15th
- 10. Shall base such selection upon, but not necessarily restricted to
 - a. Scholarship ability (high school average)
 - b. General appearance
 - c. Personality
 - d. Ambition (initiative)
 - e. Moral character
 - f. Financial need
 - g. Extracurricular activities
- 11. Shall inform the Town of Brownville Lions Club President of their selection for 1st, 2nd and 3rd place by June 1st
- 12. Shall work on a voluntary basis
- 13. Shall not be a relative of a candidate
